



Post 16 Education - qualifications and options

School based 6th Forms offer A Levels and some BTEC Certificates/ Diplomas that can be taken in combination with each other, whereas Further Education Colleges tend to offer a range of A Levels and stand alone vocational qualifications including T Levels and apprenticeships. Colleges offer more flexibility in terms of entry requirements. Where you study depends on your preferences and the qualification you want to study. 
Applied General/ Vocational Qualifications

- Level 1
- Level 2

These practical learning programmes relate to specific job roles or employment sectors and run at various levels depending on GCSE results/ experience

Find out more about these qualifications here

- As well as time in class, they also include an emphasis on work experience and are designed with employers, universities and professional/trade organisations. They are referred to in various ways and include BTECs, Diplomas, Certificates, C&G, VRQ and more
- ▶ Some progression opportunities: University, Apprenticeship (higher/ degree) or Employment
- Who do they suit?
- Ideal for students with one specific subject or vocational area in mind, with a practical and 'hands on' learning style.
- To note: These qualifications are being phased out and replaced by T Levels and T Level Transition Programmes. Click here to find out about T Levels.



T-Levels

- T Levels are the equivalent of three A Levels. They combine classroom theory, practical learning and an industry placement to ensure students have the skills to thrive in the world of work.
- As well as offering a clear line of sight to industry, T Levels are recognised by UCAS to support applications to study at some universities.
- Colleges now offer many T-Levels at level 3. The range of subjects you can study is increasing each year and there are now level 2 'T Level Transition programmes' to allow students to pursue the opportunity if they did not achieve the grades needed at school.




Apprenticeships

- Apprenticeships are ideal if you have a clear idea of the career you'd like to pursue, and you're willing to commit to work and study. Unlike in school or at college, the majority of your learning will be through on-the-job training in your place of work.
- Apprenticeships aren't the 'easy' option. Holding down a full-time job and studying takes commitment and hard work, and it won't be right for everyone.

International Baccalaureate (IB)

- An alternative to A Levels that is highly regarded by universities including Russell Group and Oxbridge, and employers worldwide. As with A Levels the IB is very much an academic route, but unlike A Levels where 3 subjects are chosen, when studying the IB you choose to study 6 subjects, giving students a broader pathway through FE.
- ► This is often only available at fee paying, independent schools. It is however offered at Bridgwater and Taunton College for free. Click here to find out more.
